
Exclusive Interview with Dr. Saleh bin Hamed al-Harbi, Vice President of University of Tabuk

**SMJS-MET:** We are sure that you have had many achievements in your career. What would it be if you were asked to single out the proudest moments of your career?




Some considerate solutions to help solving the problem, such as: nets, giant foam balls, laser blasts, etc.




