








Program administrative flowchart of Nursing Department



Department philosophy

BSN CURRICULUM

- 1. The Department of Nursing under Faculty of Applied Medical Science, University of Tabuk offers a Bachelor of Nursing Program.
- 2. The average period for the completion of the Baccalaureate degree in nursing is four academic years divided into eight academic semesters
- 3. The program consists of general education and professional courses.
- 4. Professional courses of BSN program begin in the second year (Level 3) and threaded through the development of the competencies up to the fourth year.
- 5. A Semester is comprised of fifteen weeks duration inclusive of registration and examination periods.
- 6. Completion of the total program credit hours is required for the Baccalaureate degreeTotal credit hours **140 credit hours**.
- 7. One year of nursing internship in a nationally or internationally approved hospital is required to earn the baccalaureate degree in nursing.
- 8. The language of instruction in the program is English.



AIMS of INIP

The INIP is a crucial part of undergraduate nursing programs. It was designed to provide the nurse intern with the necessary clinical and practical experiences to reinforce competence in the care and management of patients with health problems in varied settings.

The internship program (IP) is a one -year comprehensive clinical practicum designed for the fifth year nursing students to complete the BSN degree.

The INIP is carried out in selected health care institutions duly accredited or recognized by the government and the university. It is carefully designed to be able to provide opportunity for the students to be extensively exposed in the different units in the hospital setting to augment and enhance previous clinical exposure during their third and fourth years of nursing education.

It further develops their terminal competencies to be able to function as staff nurses in both general and specialty areas in the hospital to be developed as beginning nurse practitioner, beginning nurse researcher, and beginning nurse manager.

GENERAL AIMS INTENSIVE INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

- To obtain knowledge and understanding of the organizational structures, functions, practices, and policies of the host institution.
- To enhance critical thinking and problem solving skills in the application of the nursing process when caring for patients with different health problems.
- To be able to perform nursing procedures safely and competently.









- To be able to establish the professional communication and collaboration skills with other health care providers and work as a team player.
- To demonstrate professional ethics and behavior through professional interaction with other members of the health team, patients and families.
- To establish leadership and management skills.
- To maintains accurate and updated documentations in the patient's medical record patient information utilizing the nursing process.
- To conduct appropriate health education activities to client based on needs assessment of the client.

FIELD EXPERIENCE INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

All hospitals, which meet the criteria of the internship program, will be the training hosts where the interns will practice their clinical skills in order to complete and achieve the Internship objectives.

The Internship Coordinator from the Department of Nursing incollaboration with the Training Coordinator of the identified hospital is responsible for providing a proper training area to meet the objectives of the internship program.









Training period

- All interns in regular baccalaureate program are expected to work 40 hours a week in 12 Gregorian months and 6 Gregorian months for students who are in bridging program.
- Interns are required to join the program on dates approved by the College annually.
- An internship year of clinical experience, it include different rotations in general and specialized nursing units.
- Assume the beginning professional rank under supervision of health agency.
- Disciplines guideline from the university to be followed by the interns and university.
- Introducing students to different roles and function of nurses at clinical areas.
- Training at mangers levels and as introduction to the leader's roles.

General Policies and regulation:

DEPARTMENT OF NURSING RESPONSIBILITIES:

Arrangement to make up a missed major examination (e.g. long exam, mid-term and final exams) due to authorized excused absence shall be initiated by the students within one week from the end of the excused absence. Normally, a make- up exam shall occur within two weeks from the time that the student initiates arrangement for it. Instructors are encouraged to refrain from giving make up examinations during the last three days prior to the first of the final examination.

There are only **4** acceptable excuses for an individual missing an exam as the following

- 1-Illness –an official medical certificate from any government physicians certifying the kind of illness and the date when the student can return to class. This must be submitted not later than 7 days after the date of missed exam
- 2-Funeral attendance a proof of funeral attendance with the date of the internment must be clearly stated. this must be submitted not later than 7 days after the date of missed exam
- 3-Mandatory courtroom appearance- a copy of the official court summons with the date of the required attendance must be clearly spelled out. . this must be submitted not later than 7 days after the date of missed exam
- 4- Athletic event participation a signed letter from the couch no later than one week prior to the day of the exam. This must be submitted not later than 7 days after the date of missed exam.
- 5. Students, who do not confirm to this policy, will not be allowed to take a make –up examination.
- 1. Unexcused Absence- The student will be given a separate set of examination and schedule on the availability of both student and lecturer, upon the approval of Supervisor of Department and Dean based on the presented excuses.









Class Policy:

- Students should be punctual for the lab activities and other relative meetings.
- All students are expected to behave in a courteous and respectful manner to academic staff, fellow students and administrative staff.
- During skills lab activities, mobile phones should be switched off.
- Mobile phones with cameras are allowed in the. (Female section).
- Students whose behavior is considered inappropriate may be asked to leave the class.
- Students are allowed to ask questions during skills lab activities for seeking clarifications.
- Students should respect the culture of the community (clothing, lab uniforms used in the lab and communication).
- Smoking is not permitted in the examination room and school premises.
