Can Graviola herbal plant cure cancer? – Dr. Mohammad A. Shawir

Media reports that a Shepard's in Palestine, diagnosed with end stage carcinoma of the bladder, claimed complete cure after taking Graviola as an herbal treatment. His supervising doctor confirmed the complete resolution of cancer. Graviola plant is widely used in Saudi Arabia, Iraq, Syria and Palestine. Despite the minimal research, few side effects have been associated with Graviola in term of nerve damage and movement disorder.
