





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Our alumni this week is one of the most distinctive doctors of the University, Dr. Mansour Ahmed Alanazi, an alumnus of the Faculty of Medicine.


Dr. Mansour graduated in 2014 from University of Tabuk in the 2nd batch. He finished his training as a Family Medicine resident at King Salman Military Hospital, Tabuk in 2019. He joined his dear University but this time as an Assistant Professor of Family Medicine. **How wonderful!!!!**

Dr. Mansour chose to be in this position for many reasons. Firstly, he felt that this place is his preferred place to be in; it beckoned him. Furthermore, he was enthusiastic about experiencing academic life despite all the challenges he faced in his career. It seems to him that life will be more interesting if he tried to work in many different fields as it is a part of his personality to adapt to various places. In the light of these facts, he chose Family Medicine.

Dr. Mansour thinks that the most challenging part of his job is the diversity, since it demands him as a doctor to be updated all the time, and it takes effort and time.

However, he still believes that it worth it as long as he provides a good service for his patients. Dr. Mansour was always passionate about learning, so he believes that you will learn a lot in a short period when you involve yourself in different tasks. Moreover, you must train yourself to be open, discuss, and ask, and sometimes in areas where there is no black and white, you have to try and expect to fail, as he said.





And as a doctor who passes through all the difficulties that the students face nowadays, he said that the students might have clinical, research, and administrative duties in universities, which they enjoy doing. Yet, they have to be aware that it needs good time management skills and planning. They have to critique their steps, be proactive, stay internally motivated, put a review, and evaluate their work. Those techniques will help them to remain effective.

His current goal is to assist in establishing a well-recognized specialized University Medical Center. And in the future, he aspires to have a healthy influence on the world's people.

Vision 2030 is part of our future and our country's development, and in view of that, dr. Mansour highlights Family doctors' rule in the development by

saying that Family doctors are essential playmakers in 2030 vision. The stronger primary care, the better health and health system, the holistic approach of family medicine gives it uniqueness among other specialties. It allows it to have the most significant share in the 40 initiatives that 2030 vision owns; more than 80% of them are closely related to family medicine.

Dr. Mansour continued by saying that the prevention, treatment, health promotion all are in one doctor! This concept becomes highly important in our busy daily life, in timely and cost-effective way majority of people will have full medical services in one site, the transformation which will happen to Primary Health Care Centers PHCC will be unprecedented, every citizen will have a team taking care of him, and the leader will be a family doctor.

He said to all the students who want to be in his specialty, "family doctor is a broad thinker, generalist, most of the time socially active, and multi-talented. If you have this nature, you will eventually be a good family doctor". He finished his words in comprehensive by saying that continuing and coordinated care in family medicine will work as a cornerstone of our future health system.

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The second semester has started, and another clinical duty rotation has begun for most of the 3rd and 4th Year Nursing Students.

This semester, in Adult Health Nursing 2, my students are assigned to the Female Medical Ward (FMW), Female Surgical Ward (FSW), and the Diabetic Care Center.

Today, these students had their routine clinical orientation by the Nursing Director and the Nursing Education Unit of King Fahad Specialist Hospital. The Head Nurse and Quality Assurance Coordinator of the Diabetic Care Center also gave brief orientation of the Center, followed by a quick tour of the different assigned wards.

Right after the orientation, the students proceeded to their assigned units and began their routine related learning activities.

New learnings experienced

Given a shortened stay in the unit for patient care, some student nurses didn't expect new learning experiences to happen today. They also knew that it's the same clinical area exposure they had last semester with routine initial patient activities such as health history taking and physical assessment.

"Nothing new, just the things we normally do like observation of nursing procedure, taking vital signs, reviewing patient files, interviewing patients for our Nursing Care Plan (NCP) and the other requirements."

But some students surprisingly experienced something new that day.

"For the first time, I helped my patient position her nasal cannula, and I instructed her on proper breathing. It was a good experience, and I felt good applying what I learned." - Raghad

"I learned about infectious diseases and the Leishmanin Skin Test (LST). I also observed how the nurse takes the blood pressure and oxygen saturation (SaO2) of an old patient while the doctor auscultates the





patient's lungs. SaO₂ was abnormal, and we administered oxygen therapy per nasal cannula at 2L/min". - Shahad

"I learned today that for people with diabetes, properly cleaning the wound is very important to promote healing. This action is in addition to taking antibiotics to prevent infection." - Raedah

"Today, I was assigned in Diabetic Care Laboratory. I learned a lot seeing different cases how to take blood sample and test it for Hemoglobin A1c (HbA1c). It was an exciting experience! The staff were accommodating and kind. "- Ragghad

The students were amazed how it could be possible to come across essential learning experiences when they least expected it.

Impact on student nurses

Given a short period today, the students experienced many different patient cases. They appreciated the importance of knowledge and skills to provide quality nursing care to all types of clients. Realizing that patients depend on nurses providing bedside care and a simple task or nursing procedure made them feel responsible and motivated to learn more and do their best to become expert nurses in the future.

"It meant a lot as a nursing student. When I am in these departments and participate and help patients, even if with something simple, it makes me feel responsible and gives me the motivation to do my best and learn more to become an expert and successful nurse in the future."


The students acknowledge that the short time spent staying in the clinical area is not the basis for gaining new knowledge and skills. Recognizing the vital role of nurses makes them responsible student nurses in providing quality patient care.

Improving the learning experience

It is not enough that the learning stops at knowledge acquisition. The students realize the importance of improving their skills to be able to render quality nursing care. They candidly shared that to improve their learning experience, they shall provide maximum help as possible as they can; manage their expectations to have a happy, instead of a weird feeling; read more about the patient cases so they can understand more about it and choose the appropriate nursing interventions for each; observe the nurses well when they do any procedure, including those they have learned before; and equally important is to ask questions.

Conclusion

Nursing clinical education is patient-centered and interview specific. It's a three-part teaching-learning interaction between the clinical instructor, the students, and the patient. In the clinical setting, education is challenging, complex, and often overwhelming. In this setting, nursing students learn what real nursing means.
