Introduction

The University of Tabuk promotes active student participation in university life and institutional development through several structured platforms that enable students to express their views, share feedback, and contribute to improving the university environment. These platforms operate under the supervision of the Deanship of Student Affairs and provide organized channels for student representation and engagement.

Student representation at the University of Tabuk is supported through a number of bodies, including the Student Council, Student Advisory Councils, and Student Clubs. Each of these entities is governed by specific organizational regulations that define their structure, membership, and roles, ensuring effective student participation and communication with the university administration.

1. Student Council

The University of Tabuk has established a Student Council as a formal platform for student representation at the university level. The organizational regulations governing the Student Councils at the University of Tabuk were approved by the University Council during its fourth meeting of the academic year 1445H (10 March 2024) and subsequently endorsed by the Minister of Education.

The establishment of the Student Council aligns with the provisions of the Saudi Universities Law issued by Royal Decree No. (M/27) dated 02/03/1441H, which authorizes university councils to approve the formation of student councils and define their roles and responsibilities. The initiative also supports the objectives of the University of Tabuk's Third Strategic Plan, which emphasizes enhancing the student experience and strengthening student engagement in university governance.

The Student Council is chaired by the President of the University, with the Vice President for Educational Affairs serving as Deputy Chair and the Dean of Student Affairs acting as Secretary. The council includes student representatives from each college and branch campus, in addition to representatives of students with disabilities, scholarship students, and postgraduate students. Membership also ensures representation from both male and female students.

Student representatives are nominated by their respective colleges and formally appointed by the University President. The term of membership is one year, renewable once.

The council aims to strengthen communication between students and university leadership, identify student needs and aspirations, promote a sense of belonging among students, develop leadership skills, and encourage student participation in discussions and decisions related to student affairs.

During its regular meetings, the Student Advisory Council discusses key issues related to student life and university services. For example, the second meeting of the council in its first cycle for 2025 was chaired by Abdulaziz bin Salem Al-Ghamdi, President of University of Tabuk, in the presence of the Vice President for Educational Affairs and the Dean of Student Affairs. The meeting addressed several topics, including major student initiatives, opportunities to enhance student activities and university services, and ways to strengthen communication channels between the university administration and students. The meeting concluded with a recognition ceremony honoring members whose terms had ended, in appreciation of their contributions and efforts during their membership.

The Deanship of Student Affairs periodically announces the opening of nominations for membership in the Student Council at the university level through its official communication channels. These announcements invite eligible students to apply for the specified council positions, as outlined in the organizational regulations. This process aims to empower students to actively contribute to the development of the university environment and to ensure that student perspectives are represented through structured and transparent participation mechanisms.

Article 3 (page 10) specifies that membership in student clubs is a right for all enrolled students, including undergraduate, scholarship, and postgraduate students. These regulations ensure structured participation, equal opportunities for involvement, and a safe and inclusive environment for all members.

Advisory Committees

The University of Tabuk has established Advisory Committees, which consist of individuals with specialized knowledge, professional expertise, and relevant experience in their respective fields. These committees provide guidance and recommendations to college administrations and their academic programs, ensuring that diverse perspectives are considered in education, research, and community engagement to meet labor market requirements locally, regionally, and globally.

Responsibilities of the Advisory Committees include:

- Providing recommendations for the development of the college's strategic plan and program implementation plans, particularly in teaching, research, and community service, in alignment with Saudi Vision 2030.
- Advising on academic programs and curricula, and offering recommendations for their enhancement according to professional standards, labor market needs, and program evaluation outcomes.
- Reviewing annual program reports, including beneficiary surveys, learning outcomes assessments, teaching strategies, evaluation methods, key performance indicators, improvement opportunities, and implementation plans.
- Analyzing field experience reports and proposing solutions to enhance professional practice.
- Evaluating the alignment of graduate skills with workforce needs, considering updates in the field and societal requirements.
- Supporting the establishment of agreements, memoranda of understanding, and collaborations with academic institutions, industry partners, and research centers.

- Facilitating connections with employers and organizations to provide students with volunteer work opportunities and part-time employment experiences.
- Promoting the college's academic programs, research capabilities, and community services to business and professional sectors.
- Advising on academic, research, and community service matters, with the College Council considering the committee's recommendations.

Students are also invited to participate in discussions on topics deemed relevant by the committee chair, ensuring that student perspectives are incorporated into the advisory process. The procedural manual outlines the administrative structure and operational framework of these advisory committees.
